### About SOSS Waves 79a and 79b




In February, Governor Gretchen Whitmer received a rating of "excellent" or "good" from 36.6% of Michigan residents.

By May, those favorable ratings had jumped to 51.9%.



President Donald Trump's favorable ratings changed very little from February to May. He received ratings of "excellent" or "good" from 39.2% of Michigan residents in February, and 39.5% in May.

About half of survey respondents gave Trump a "poor" rating.



When we look beneath the statewide averages, the ratings for Trump and Whitmer reveal stark differences in attitudes, by race, sex, and party affiliation.





Trump "Excellent" or Good"	39.5%	84.6%	38.3%	7.7%

Between February and May, the fraction who say they are *better* off than one year ago decreased by 16 percentage points.

The fraction who say they are worse off than one year ago increased by about the same amount.



Michigan residents' assessment of whether they will be better off one year from now also deteriorated.
