Definitions of Underserved

- MUA: Medically Underserved Area
- MUP: Medically Underserved Population
- MUA/P: Designation for an area that is both a medically underserved area and medically underserved population.
- HPSA: Health Professional Shortage Area.
- Exceptional MUP: Unique circumstances allow for a designation as a MUP for Health Center and J1 Visa program.
- Governors Certified Shortage area: Governor has discretion to designate areas as underserved for RHC.

Shortage area designations can apply to a geographic area, population group or a facility. "Underserved" is calculated by a combination of (1) percentage of population below the poverty level, (2) percentage of population ages 65 and over, (3) infant mortality rate and (4) ratio of primary care physicians per 1000 population.

MEDICARE RURAL HOSPITAL FLEX PROGRAM

CAH: Critical Access Hospital

Requirements

- -25 or fewer inpatient acute care beds
- -35 miles from another hospital (or more than 15 miles of secondary roads)
 - -ALOS less than 96 hours
 - -Provide 24/7 emergency care services
- -Must have a agreement with an acute care hospital for patient transfers and quality assurance.

Benefits

- -Medicare" cost based reimbursement" (Also eligible for Medicaid cost based reimbursement)
 - -Flexible staffing and services (if permitted by state law.)
 - -Access to FLEX program grants
 - -Can use "swing beds".
