



Social Determinants of Health


Social Determinants of Health are the complex, integrated, and overlapping social structures and economic systems that are responsible for most health inequities. These social structures and economic systems include the social environment, physical environment, health services, and structural and societal factors. Social determinants of health are shaped by the distribution of money, power, and resources throughout local communities, nations, and the world.

Michigan System

Michigan's 45 local public health departments play a vital role in protecting the public health of the residents of Michigan. Michigan statute requires local health departments to "continually and diligently endeavor to prevent disease, prolong life, and promote the public health through organized programs, including ... prevention and control of diseases... particularly vulnerable population groups;



Public Health Structure

After multiple past executive reorganizations and administrative restructuring, public heath responsibilities have been spread across several state departments (rather than remaining the purview of the state health department – presently the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services).

The Department of Environmental Quality and Department of Agriculture and Rural Development have assumed important public health roles, and public health functions are also fulfilled by the State Police and the Department of Licensing and Regulatory affairs.

This fragmentation might be considered both a symptom and a cause of the marginalization of public health in Michigan.

Infectious Disease Control

Local public health departments are the only central tracking source in the state for infectious disease incidence; that is, all new cases of infectious disease are reported to local health departments for monitoring and investigation

Tracking reportable disease at the local level ensures proper identification and followup of diseases.

Local health departments ensure that those affected receive appropriate treatment; track other people with whom infected individuals may have had contact for vaccination, treatment, quarantine, and education; and investigate and stop outbreaks

Essential Service: Communicable Disease

From 2014 to 2017, the reported number of Michigan communicable disease cases has increased by 58%.



Facility and congregate setting outbreak investigation and management


Daily communications with community leaders, public, and media
