Importance of Newborns Law

The Safe Delivery of Newborns law was enacted January 1, 2001, in response to an increase in the number of newborn infants abandoned in unsafe places.

The law targets troubled parents and encourages the placement of a newborn no more than 72 hours old with an emergency service provider. An emergency service provider is defined as an uniformed or otherwise identified employee of a fire department, police station or hospital that is inside and on duty. It also can include a paramedic or EMT who responds to a 9-1-1 call.

The law allows that the surrender be anonymous, but encourages the parent to share relevant background information which will be kept confidential. The surrendered infant will be placed with an approved adoptive family.
