

#### The "eyes and voice" of the people





#### Cycle of Accountability






# Cycle of Accountability







#### Origin of Investigation Topics


- Committee jurisdiction


# Routine vs. Event -Driven Oversight

Routine	Event -Driven	
Program outcomes	Scandal	
Budgetary	Disaster	
Contracts	Chronic problems	
Compliance	Escalating problems	
Deter malfeasance	Long-term investigation	



#### Your Superpowers

- Legislator phone calls and emails get returned
- Legislators can request investigations and reports
- Legislator questions trigger research, reconsideration, and change
- Oversight can have as much, or more, impact as legislation





## Phases of an Investigation

- 1.Fact-finding
- 2. Written product
- 3.Hearing
- 4.Follow -up



#### **Factual Questions**

- Not a hypothesis
- Process-orientated
- "How" and "what" questions, not "yes" or "no"

Great!	Less great	
What kinds of oil spills happen in the Great Lakes and how are they handled?	How come we don't have bigger fines for shipping companies responsible for oil spills?	
How does service availability differ for Medicaid recipients in different parts of the state?	Why are behavioral health services so bad in rural areas?	



#### **Oversight Scenario**

One year after a flood devastated a community in Michigan, the legislature wishes to check in on the disaster response performance. How would you go about using oversight to obtain facts on how the State of Michigan responded to a flood?

#### Recommendations for Strengthening Oversight

- Joint oversight committee with balanced party membership
- Bipartisan approach to topics, inquiry, witnesses, questions, etc.
- More follow -up (e.g., hearings) on reports published by analytic bureaucracies
- Include contract oversight
- Create oversight plan for your office
- Be transparent about oversight outcomes: post status and results of

investigations
