Submissions may be sent by email using 1.5-line spacing in Times Roman Font, size 10. Formats in Microsoft Word and Google Docs, on a 60-character line, are appreciated.

In line with Michigan State University style guidelines, for external communications like materials published at [ippsr.msu.edu](http://ippsr.msu.edu), the [MSU Editorial Style Guide](#) is followed. MSU's Editorial Style Guide follows the most current editions of The Associated Press Stylebook and Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary unless superseded by the Style Guide. Parenthetical notation with endnotes is preferred.

For charts and figures, Microsoft Excel is preferred. Actual data for figures is preferred. Images should be high resolution (300 dpi) for best clarity and attached to the emailed document. An image may be embedded to notate location or placement.

Images should be the author's original or appropriately credit. All university copyright guidelines should be followed.
