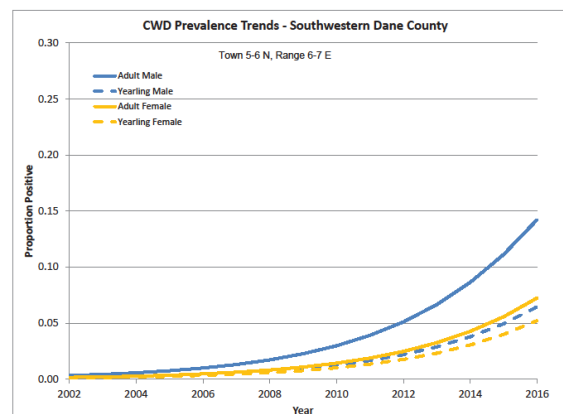
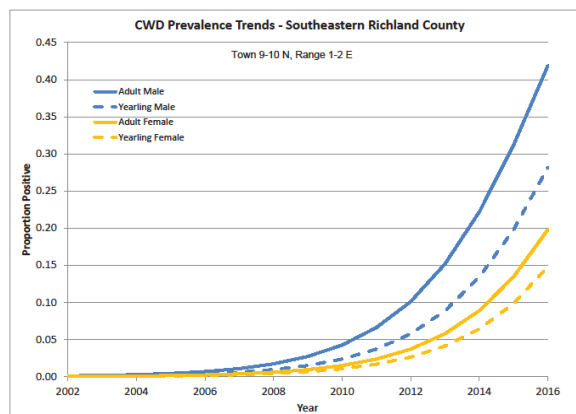
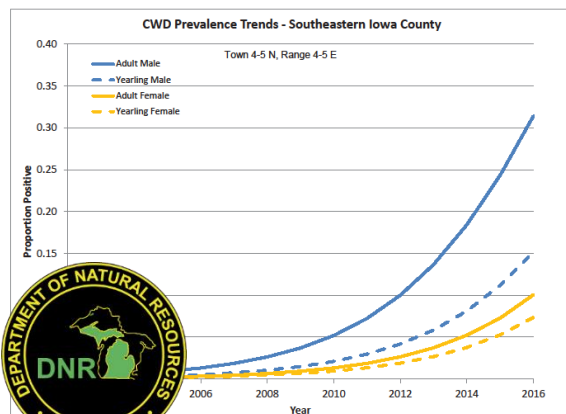
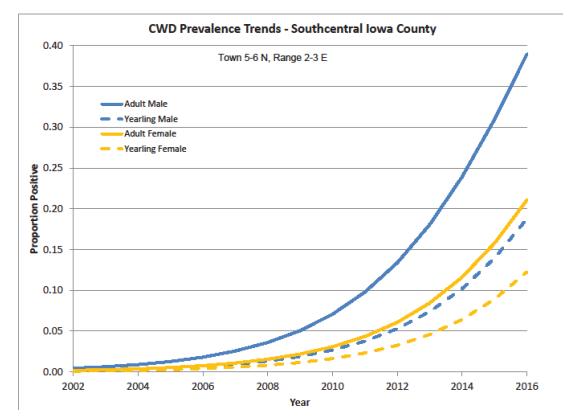
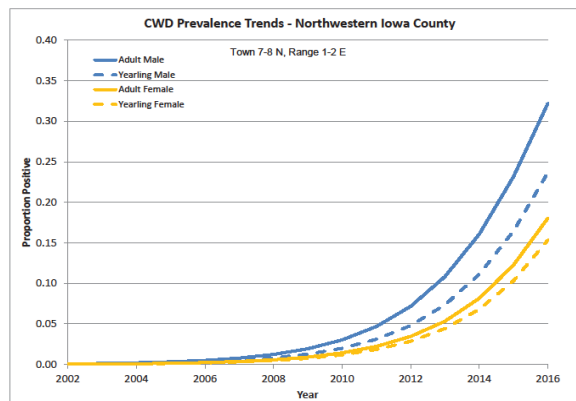
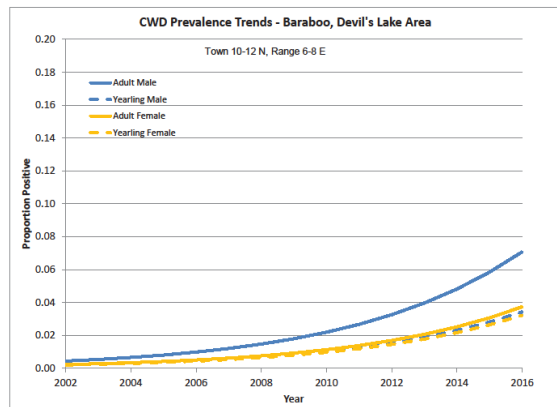
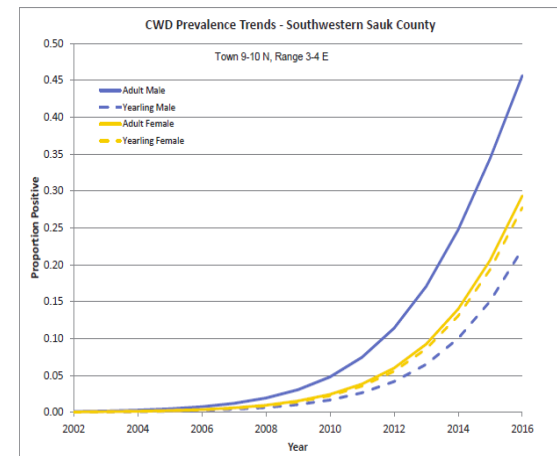
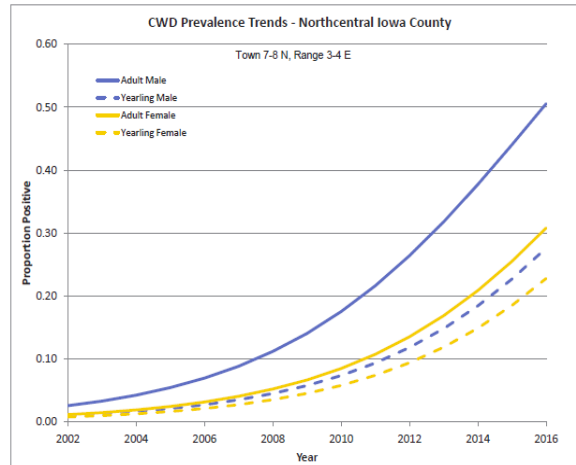
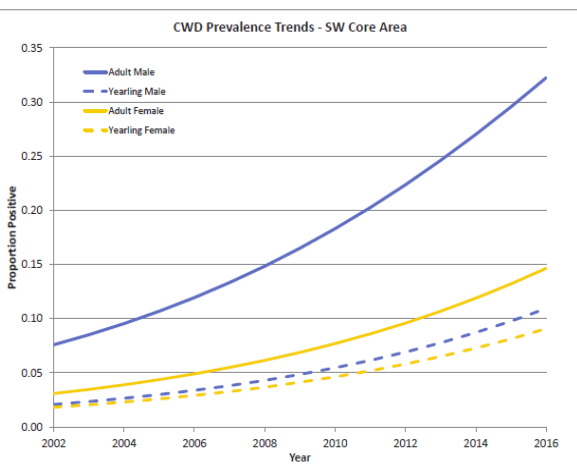




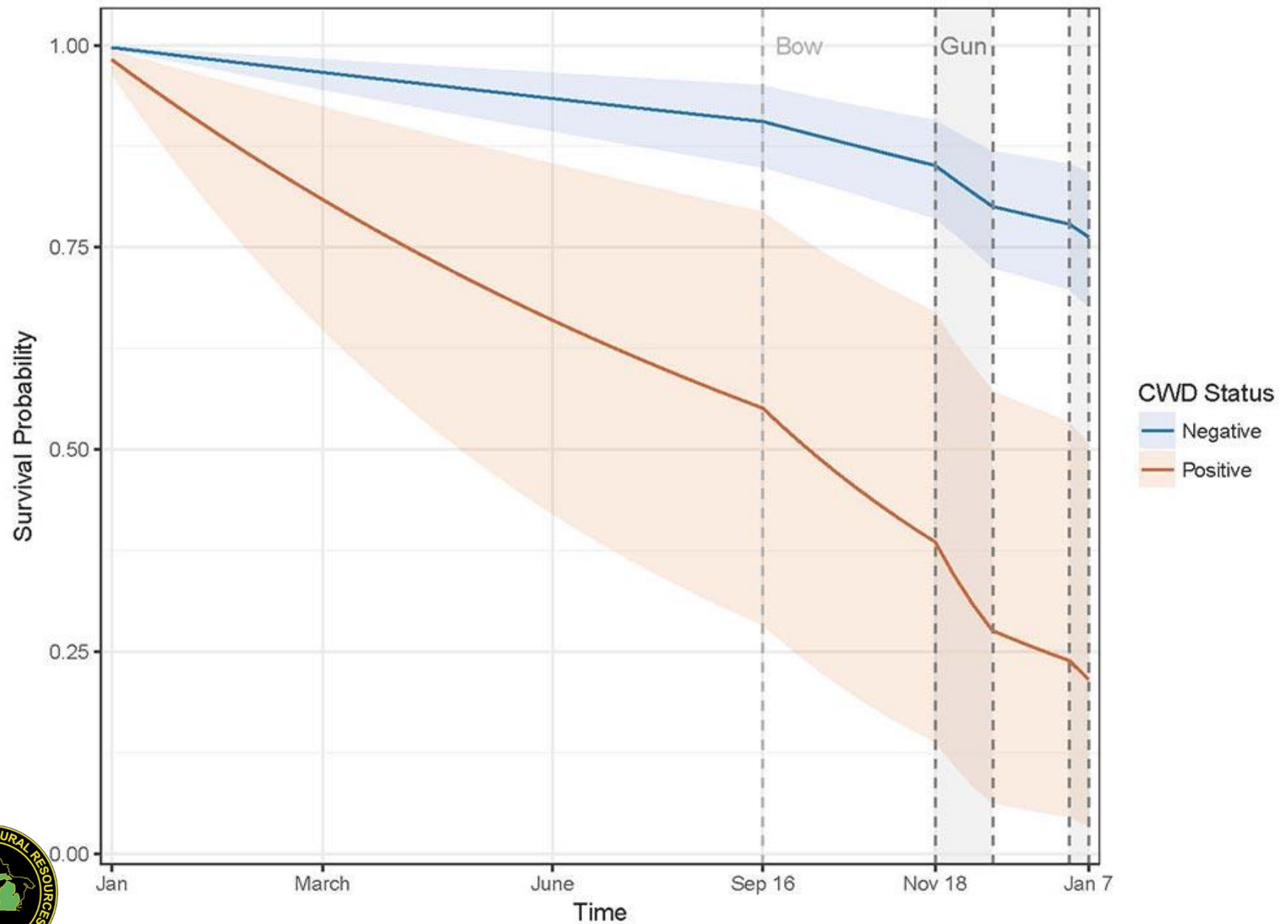
# Free-ranging White-tailed Deer Positive for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Michigan as of March 18, 2019

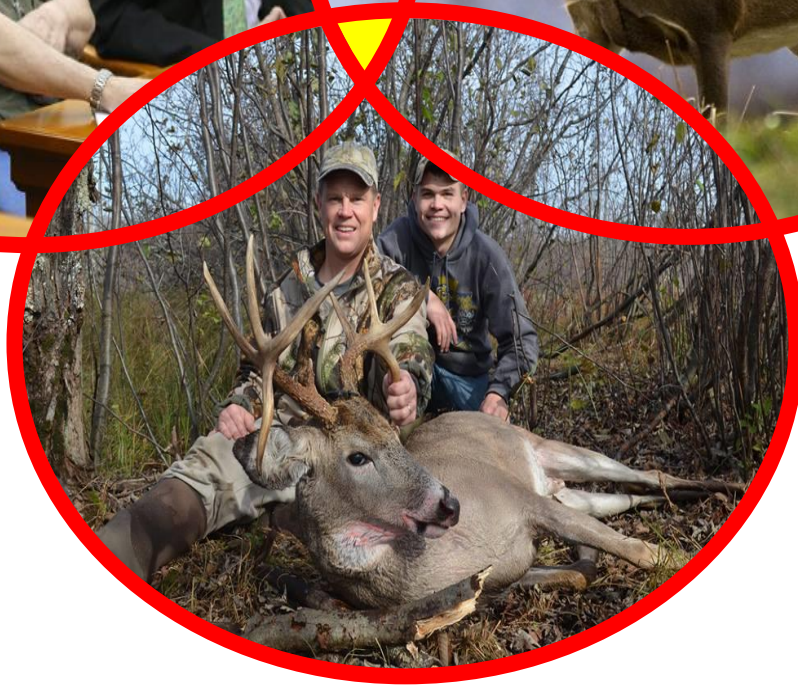

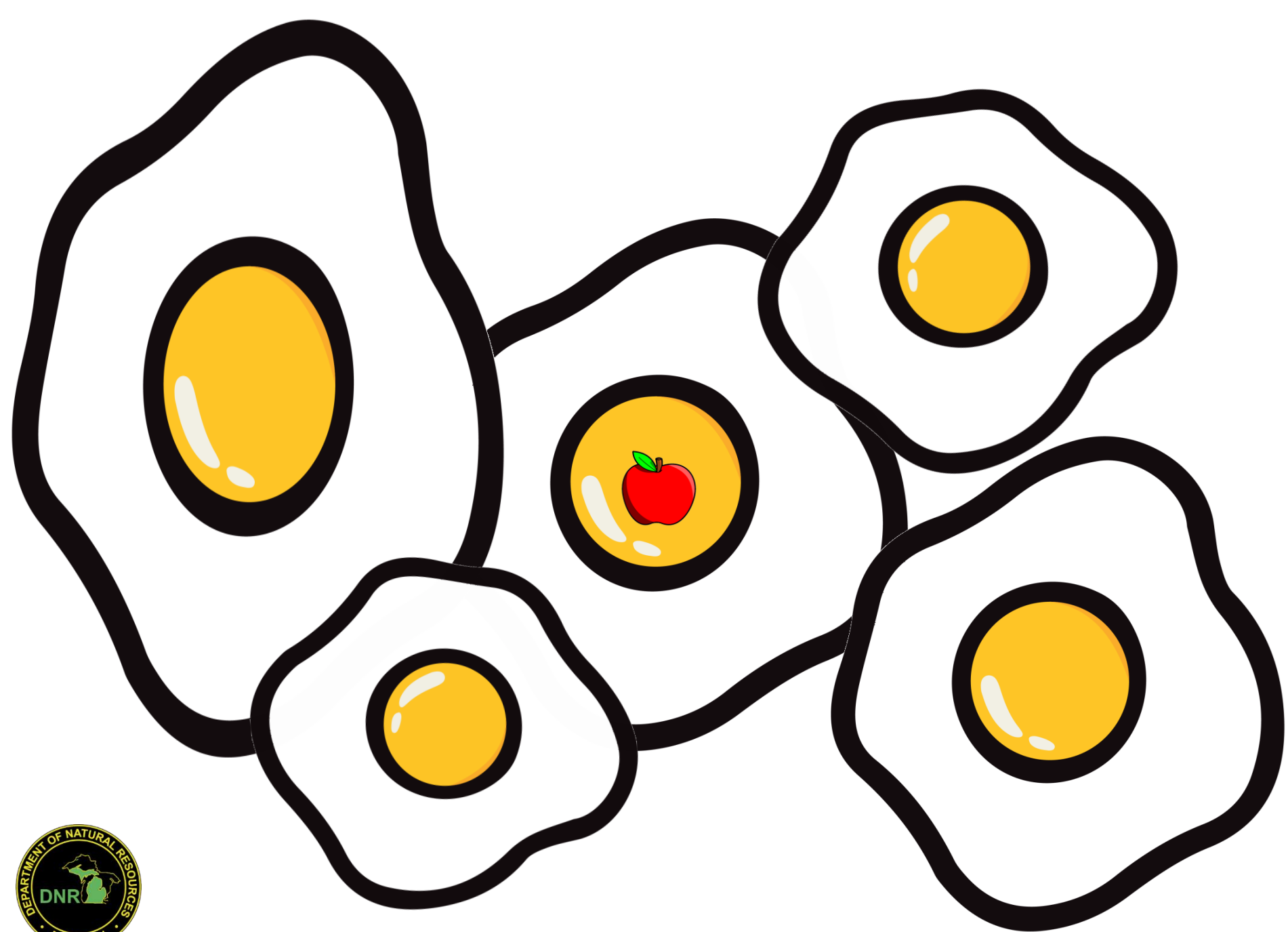


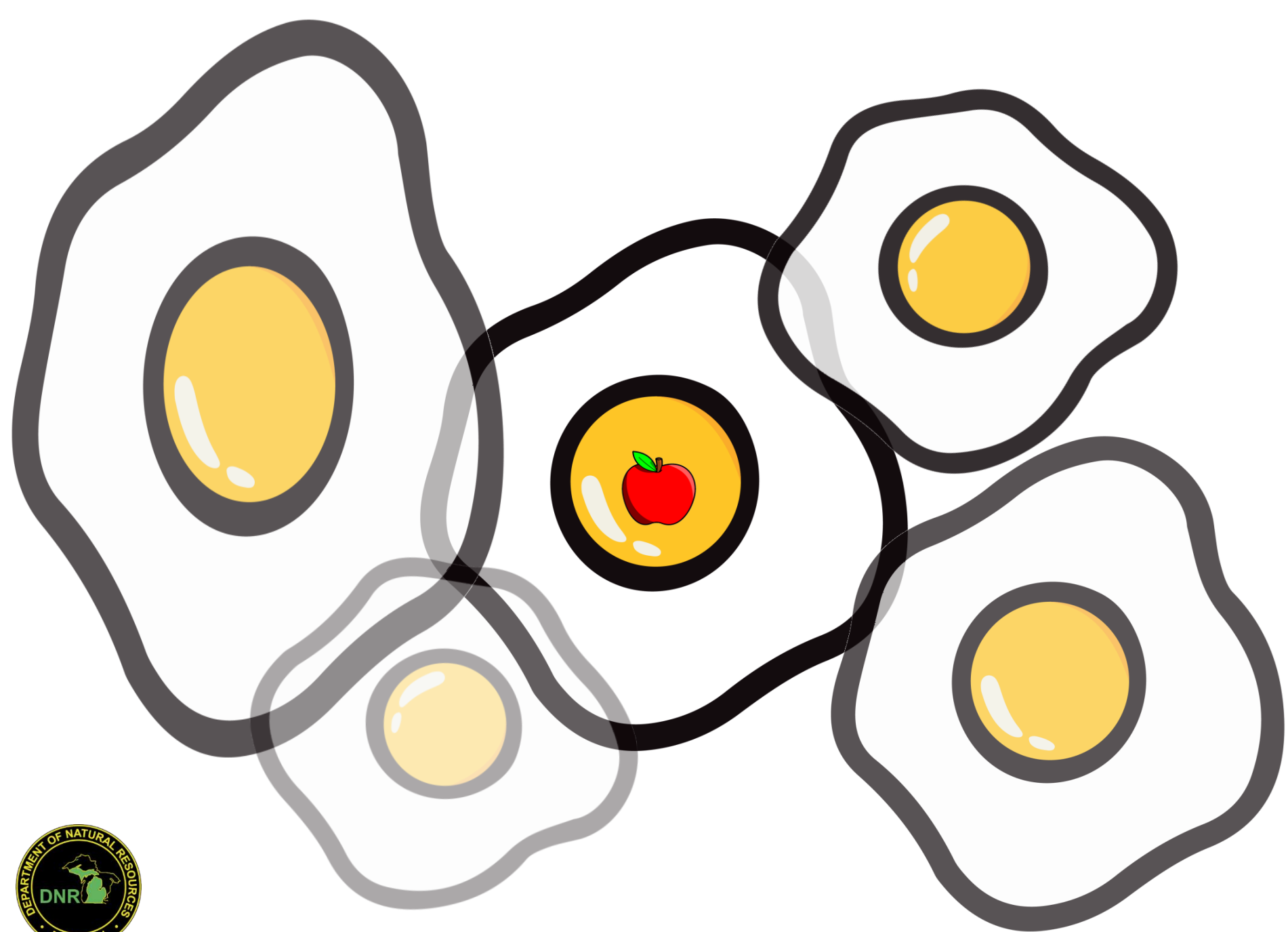












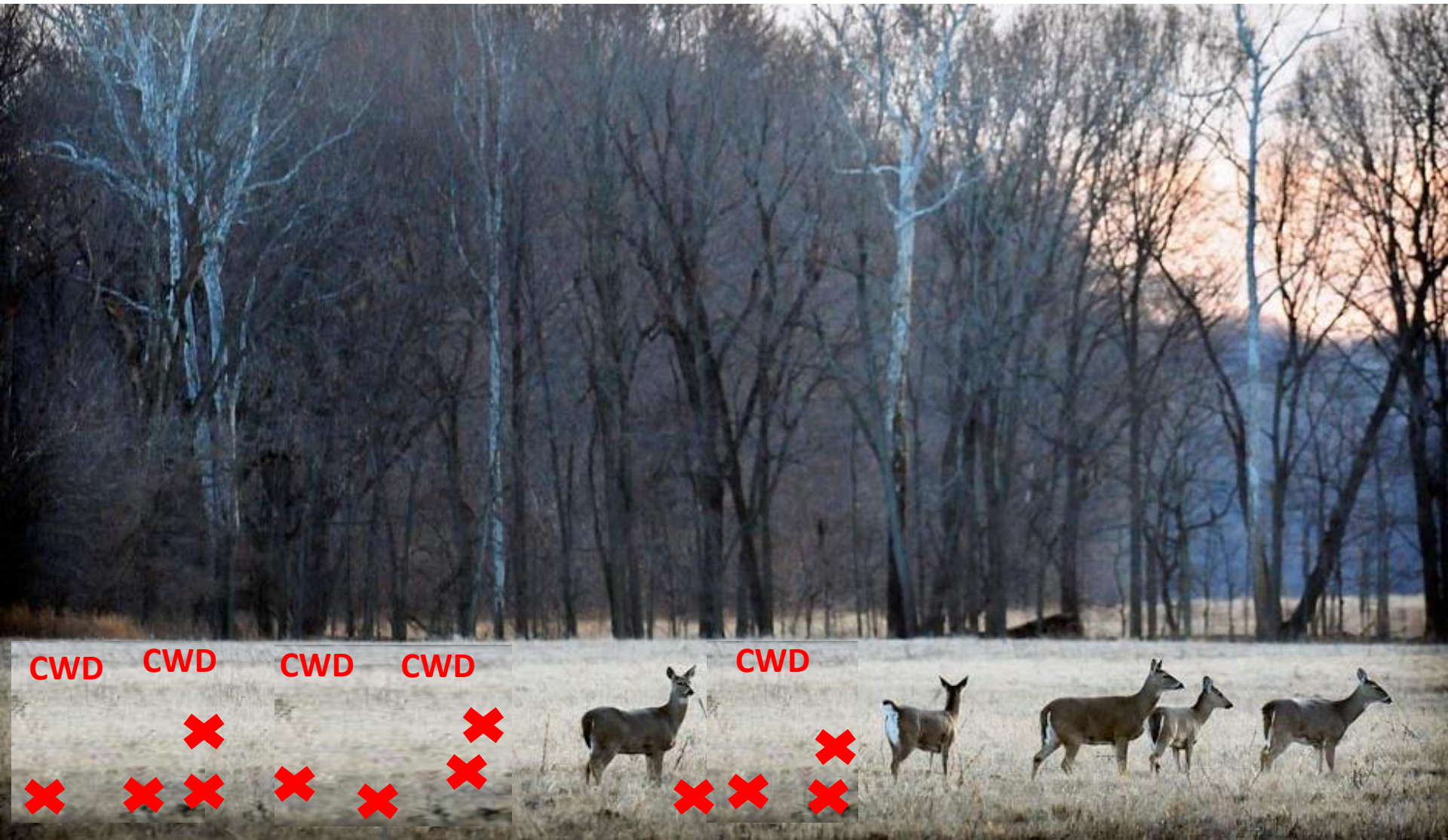


# Scenario 1: Early Detection and Aggressive Response
