Employment

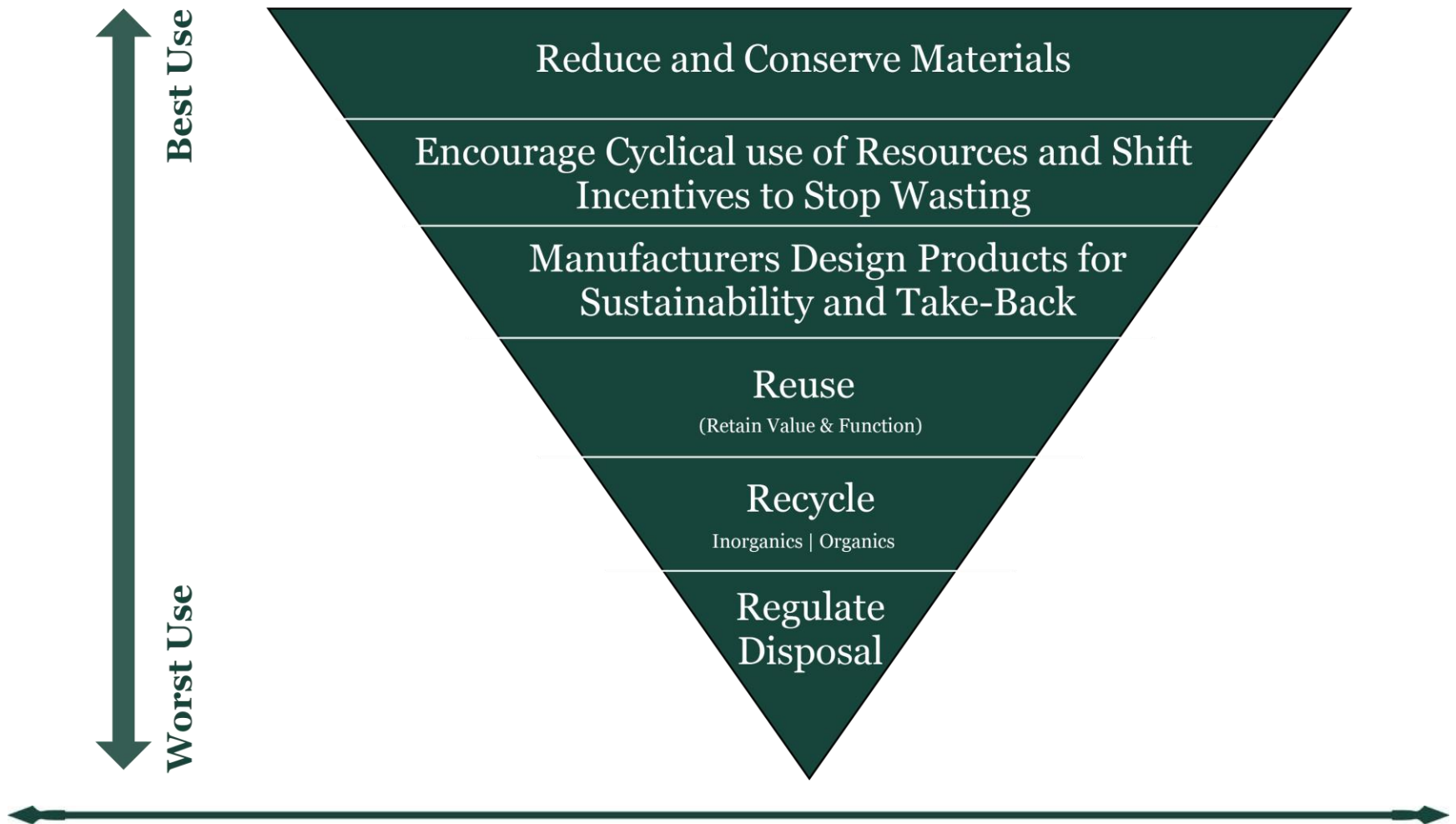
- Employ 70-80 students. Providing opportunities for high-level experience in solid waste management that includes access to professional development and networking opportunities for internships and future employment.

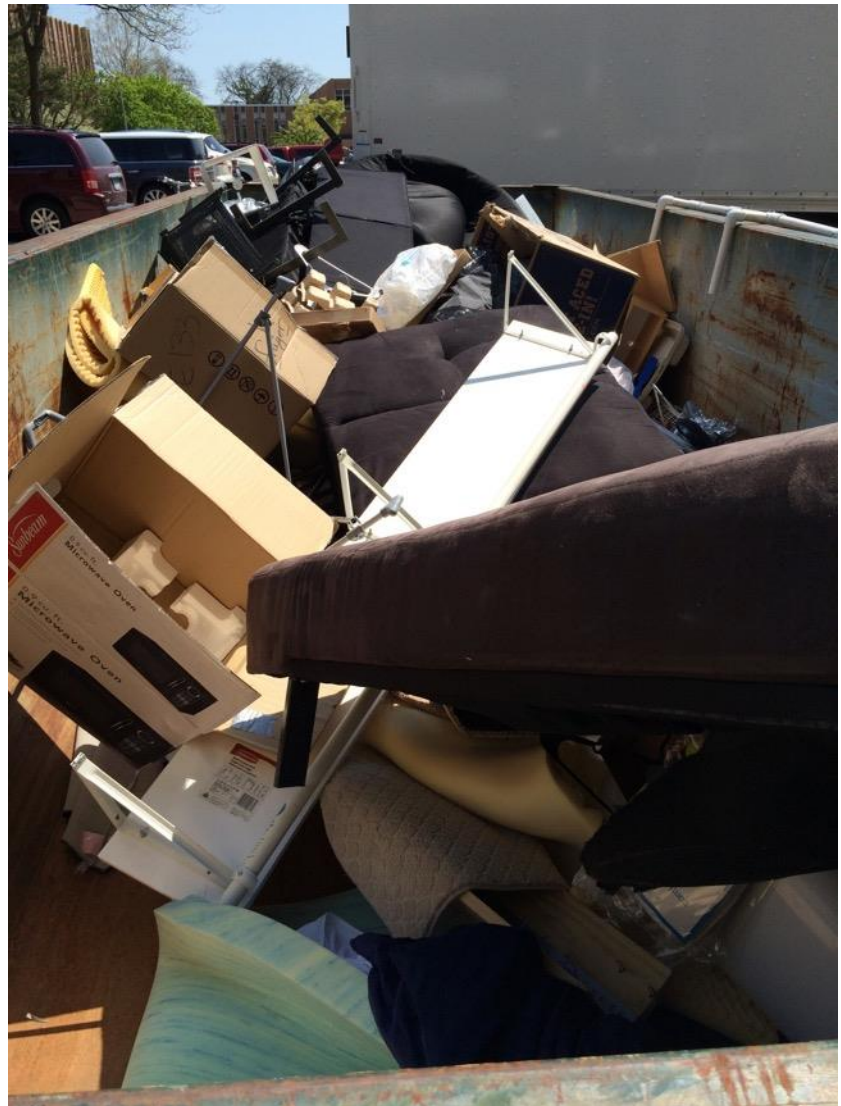

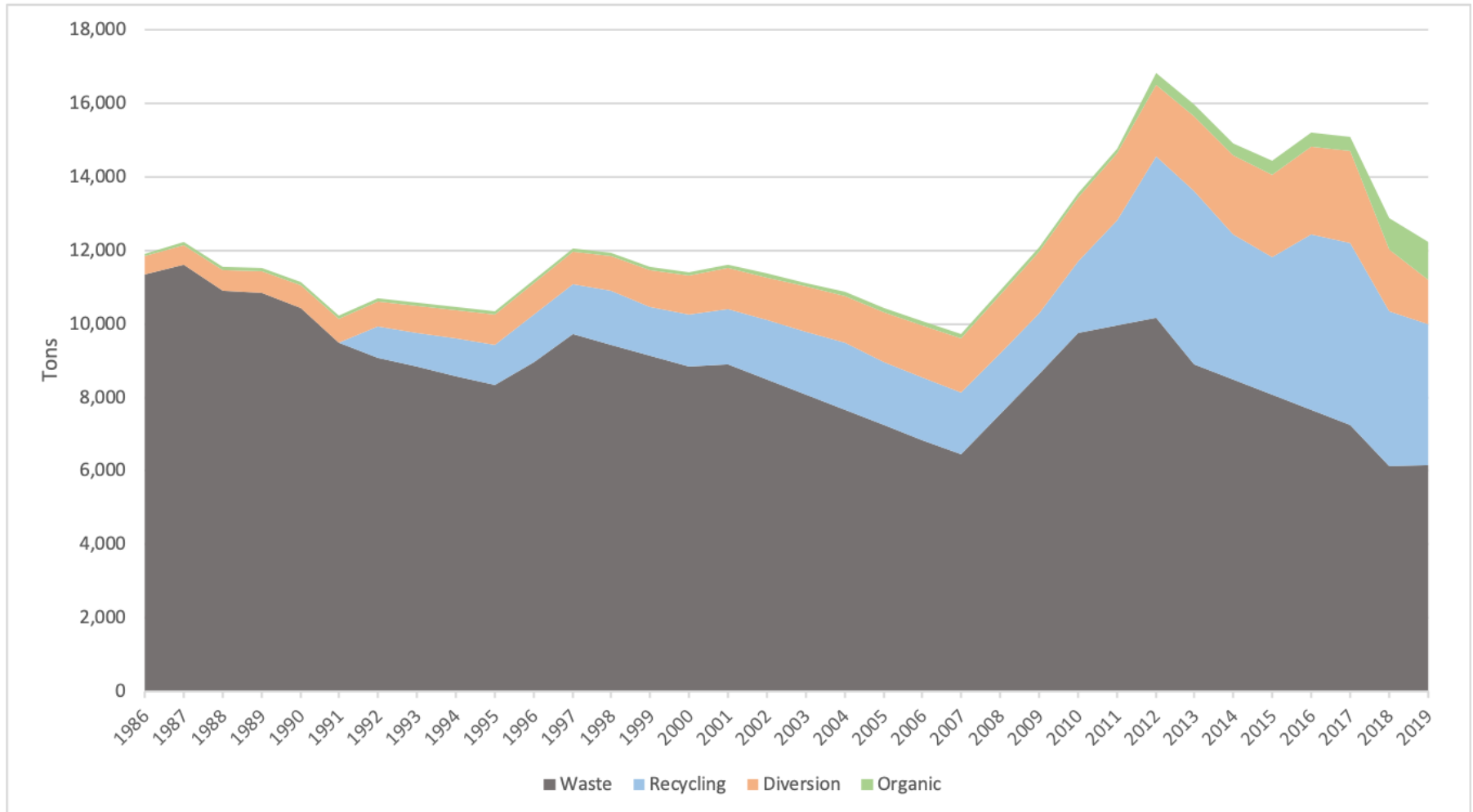

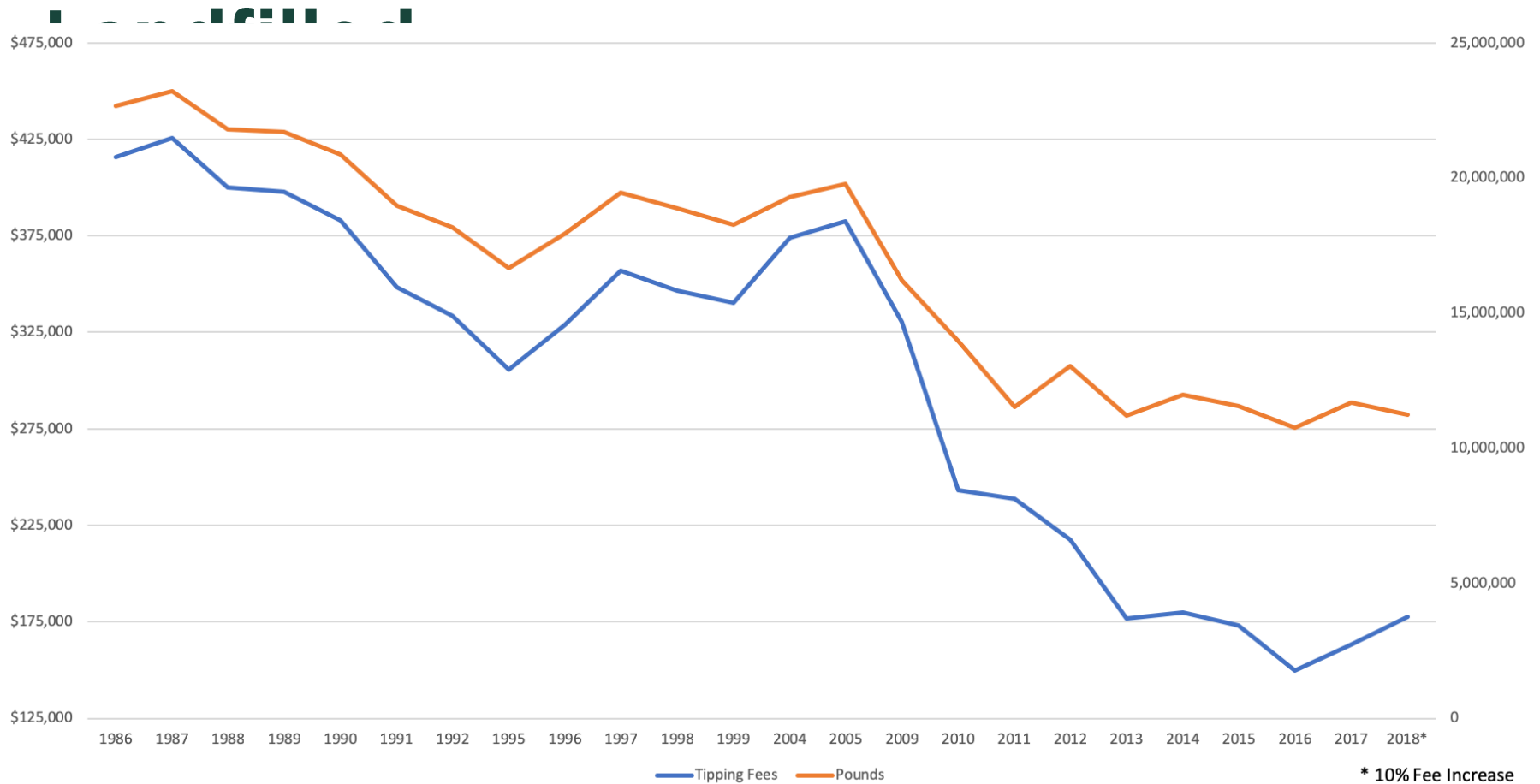
Material Recovery Facility (MRF)



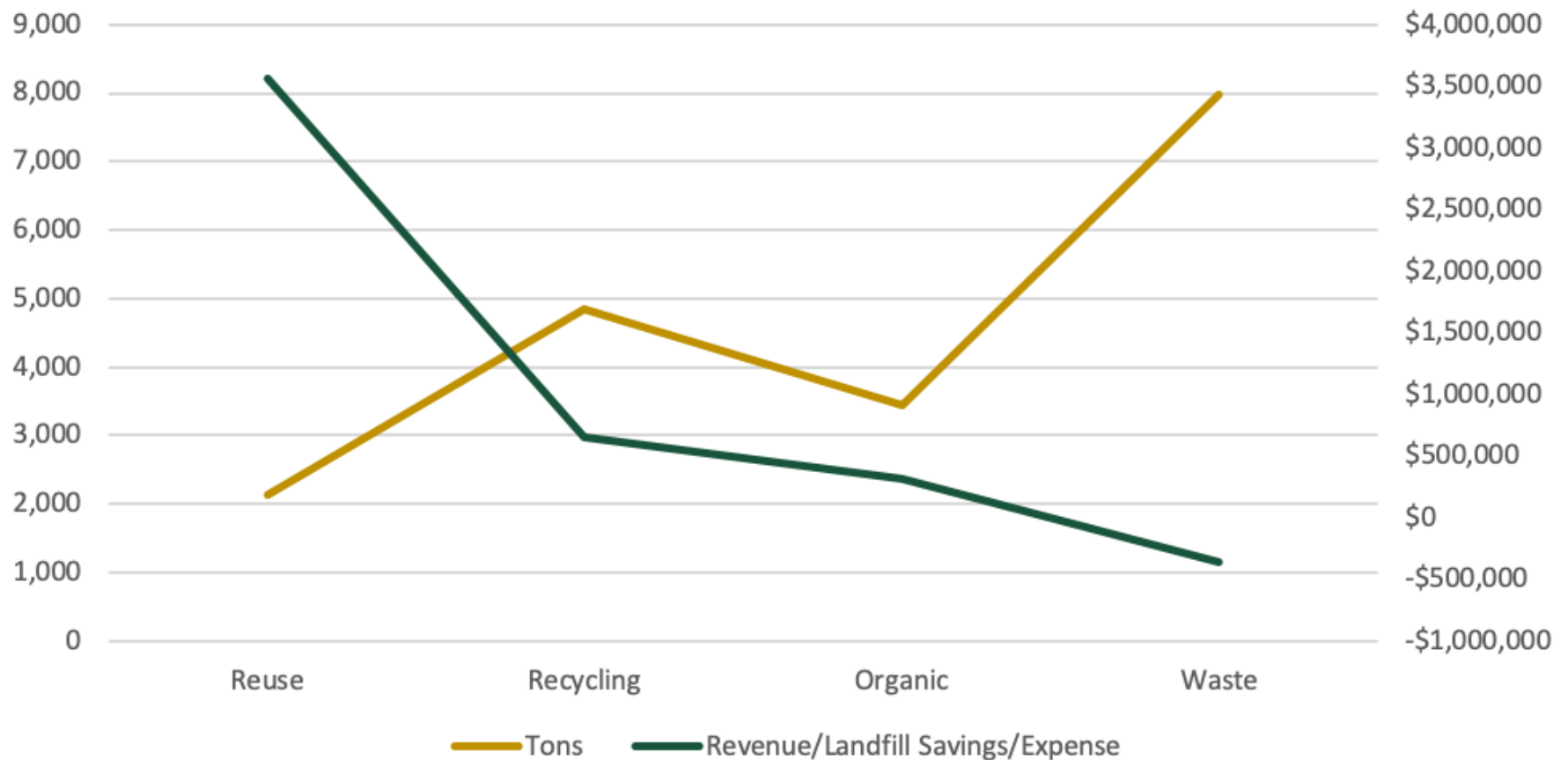
30 Years of Materials Management at MSU
